RoHS Compliance Statement

Adopted in February 2003 by the European Union, the Restriction of Hazardous Substances Directive (RoHS) governs the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment. Commonly referred to as the “lead-free directive,” RoHS restricts the use of the following ten substances:

- Lead
- Cadmium
- Polybrominated diphenyl ethers (PBDEs)
- Bis (2-ethylhexyl) phthalate (DEHP)
- Diisobutyl phthalate (DIBP)
- Mercury
- Hexavalent Chromium
- Polybrominated biphenyls (PBBs)
- Dibutyl phthalate (DBP)
- Butyl benzyl phthalate (BBP)

Our commitment to safety and compliance necessitates that we rely on our suppliers to provide comprehensive and precise data regarding these materials.
